SCHOOL RULES — SAFE, READY, RESPECTFUL.

There are just 3 simple, clear and coherent behaviour expectations.

This makes it easy for adults and children to recognise good behaviours and expectations.

They are easy to follow and easy to remember enabling all children and all adults to embrace them.

BE SAFE

We are SAFE when:

- * we move around school in a safe manner;
- * we follow instructions to keep ourselves safe e.g. on school trips;
- * we use equipment safely;
- * we stay safe online;
- * we cross roads safely;
- * we keep our hands and feet to ourselves...

BE READY

We are READY to learn when:

- * we arrive at school on time;
- * we have our equipment ready;
- * we show that we are listening,
- * we are ready to start lessons;
- * ready to listen and follow instructions.

BE RESPECTFUL

We are RESPECTFUL when:

- * we listen when others speak;
- * we respect the property of our friends and the school;
- * we show manners;
- * we consider others' feelings;
- * we focus our attention;
- * we show effort

Attendance

If a child misses	that equals	which is	and over 13 years of school that's

Lunsford Primary monitors the attendance of every child in the school. We work with and support those children and their families who are not attending school without sufficient reason. <u>Our attendance target for this academic year is 96.5% attendance.</u>

To put this in perspective 95% sounds good, but means that your child misses:

- one half day each fortnight
- two weeks every school year
- over three-quarters of a school year in a school career

Attendance



- * A key factor in a child's success at school is regular and punctual attendance.
- * We will reward good attendance
- * We will be robust in chasing up poor attendance and children who are persistently late
- * Term-time holidays will not be authorised unless there are exceptional circumstances

Uniform



- The expectation is that all children will wear the correct school uniform. This includes smart, black shoes.
- No such thing as inappropriate weather only inappropriate clothing!
- * Sweatshirt, Polo Shirt, Black/grey trousers/skirt, summer dresses red and white

Lunsford Primary School Pupil Premium Promise

Spellings

- * In Year 3, we will be focusing on the Y3/4 word lists and spelling patterns from the National Curriculum.
- * Each week we will look at a different group of spellings from the statutory word list and learn the relevant rule or spelling pattern which will also be sent home for homework.

"Children who are taught spelling patterns systematically spell 67–76% better and also become stronger readers and writers."

Times Tables

- * Times tables is a key area of Maths in Year 3 and beyond! Good knowledge of times tables is essential.
- * This year we will be revising our 2x, 5x and 10x tables (Autumn Term) and learning our 3x, 4x and 8x tables (Spring- Summer Term).
- * We will have weekly times tables lessons called rainbow times tables. This is where children will work on a particular times table. When they score confidently in that times table 3 times in a row then they move to the next timetable. The children seem to enjoy this way of practising!
- * Helping your child learn their times tables is the best way you can support their Maths at home.
- * We use TT Rockstars in school which children can also access at home. www.ttrockstars.com. All children have their own log in.

Times Tables

- * Some other popular websites are www.multiplication.com or www.timestables.co.uk
- * There are various strategies you can use to help your child learn their tables but you need to find what works best for them!
- * As well as the times table fact, children need to learn the corresponding division fact

* Eg.
$$3 \times 5 = 15$$

 $5 \times 3 = 15$
 $15 \div 3 = 5$
 $15 \div 5 = 3$

Reading

- * "Children whose parent/carers read high-quality books with them regularly score, on average, six months ahead in reading levels by age 15-with a possible four months' additional progress in literacy overall."

 OECD and the Education Endowment Foundation
- * Please listen to your child read a range of texts (even if they are fluent) every night and ask questions to ensure comprehension. Ensure that it is recorded in their reading records and that their reading records are brought into school daily.
- * On a Wednesday evening, please sign your Buster Book Club bookmark with a record of how many minutes your child has read for. We have a weekly competition to see which class reads the most!
- * At the start of the year, we do a test for each child do place them on a book band. This will change as we get to know the children better and hear them read a range of texts and answer comprehension questions.

On going homework

- * Reading to an adult 5 times a week or as much as possible.
- * Practicing times tables
- * Spelling patterns and Year3/4 words

Alongside that

- * Homework such as spellings and additional math or reading activities will be sent home on a Thursday to be returned to school before the following Thursday.
- * All children have a homework book and their work must be completed in pencil.
- * We do not expect children to spend longer than 20-30 minutes on a task.
- * If there are any problems, please encourage your child to speak to an adult in class who can help them with it.

PE

Mondays with Mr Dickinson (and swimming Fridays)

- Children to wear PE kit to school on PE days
- Trainers (which might get muddy), PE t-shirt, shorts, jogging trousers, sun hat for summer, spare socks (for those wearing tights).
- Forest School dates will be posted on Class Dojo as soon as possible. Next one Monday 13th October
- Earrings must be taken out and long hair tied back.
- Please make sure all items of PE kits and uniform are named.

Swimming

- * Swimming will be Friday afternoons (2-:2:30)
- * Children to wear uniform to school and bring swimming kit in a separate, named bag.
- * Swimming kit- towel and swimming costume/shorts If your child needs goggles, please bring those too.
- * Earrings must be taken out and long hair must be tied back.
- * We will be walking to Larkfield Leisure Centre straight after lunch to allow time to change.
- * We will need parent volunteers in order to go.

Assessment

- * Ongoing informal assessments during the year for reading, writing and maths
- * We assess the children regularly and also conduct Pupil Progress Meetings three times a year to ensure your child is on track to meet their targets.

Online Safety

- * Many Lunsford children regularly use the internet and social media and we have a duty to help them keep safe online.
