

- \* We are a small one form entry primary meaning the children forge close relationships with each other and all the adults in school.

At Lunsford we aim to develop well rounded children who are ready both for the next stage of their education, and to play a full role in society. To this end, we have designed our wider curriculum carefully to ensure that pupils have a broad and balanced experience in school. Staff work hard to ensure that pupils experience a rich curriculum, based on key skills, transferable knowledge and vocabulary, delivered in a carefully sequenced way. Key skills are developed through practice and experiential learning.

Full use is made of both the indoor and outdoor learning environments, with our core values underpinning the curriculum. We recognise that our school is unique and that our pupils deserve a curriculum that is both distinct and relevant to them.

Pupils have the opportunity to learn in a variety of ways, ensuring that all learners have the opportunity to experience success. We aim to celebrate and develop each child's individual talents and abilities in all areas.



Therefore, our intent at Lunsford is to design and deliver a curriculum which enables our pupils to develop key skills for their futures;

- Learning how to collaborate and <u>work hard</u> individually and as part of an effective team,
- Learning to <u>persevere</u>, understanding the purpose of trial and error and the <u>positive</u> ways in which we can learn from our mistakes,
- Understanding that they will be <u>responsible</u> for finding solutions to problems



- Developing a strong sense of <u>respect</u> for themselves promoting and developing their own wellbeing and celebrating their individuality

#### OFSTED June 2023



This school prepares pupils well for the future. Pupils fulfil leadership roles such as prefect, librarian and house captain. Others are ambassadors for school values, the environment, anti-bullying or online safety.

Pupils enjoy regular 'inspiration days', offering enrichment opportunities across the school. Highlights include orienteering, designing board games, Batik printing workshops and geocaching.

Well-being is embedded into experiences such as outdoor learning and mindfulness clubs. Pupils' sporting skills are nurtured through local competitions involving archery, swimming and athletics.

Pupils' musical talents flourish through piano, violin and guitar lessons. Pupils proudly share a summer concert at school and a choir performance in a large arena.

Staff expectations of pupils are high and met. Relationships are kind and caring. Pupils feel safe, happy and proud of their school.

At playtimes, everyone stays active and happy. Pupils treat each other with kindness and respect.

Children make a strong start in early years. Staff aim high, encouraging children to acquire language and number skills swiftly. Tasks are well designed and purposeful. Children show high levels of engagement. Mathematics teaching is impressive across the school. Recall activities are used daily to help pupils rehearse and embed their number skills.



## Top Tips 1



- Carry out research of as many schools as possible, read Ofsted reports and if possible, talk to parents who have children at the school. Email the school with any questions that you may have.
- Always put three choices of schools on your application, **do not** put the same school down more than once or only name one school. Doing either of these may result in you not getting allocated your preferred school, KCC will allocate you a school which you may not want your child to attend.

## Top Tips 2



- Save paperwork with your name and address and your child's name and address on it (i.e. bank statements, medical letters or nursery invoices) as you will need these later on in the process
- Make your application as soon as possible, you can go back into the system and change your mind as many times as you want until 11.59pm on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2025.
- Remember, it's about choosing the right school for your child.
- As much as we would love your child to come to Lunsford, as a school we do not make the final decision!
