<p>At Lunsford Primary School PE is an integral part of our curriculum that is inclusive and engages all children in a supportive and challenging environment. We aim to deliver high-quality teaching and learning opportunities that inspire all children to succeed in PE.</p> <p>We look to build self-esteem, confidence and resilience through hard work and a positive outlook in order to build the foundations for a lifelong love of sport, PE and a healthy lifestyle.</p> <p>Our intent is to teach children how to cooperate and collaborate with others as part of an effective team, understanding fairness, respect and equity of play to embed lifelong values.</p> <p>Our curriculum intends to improve the wellbeing and fitness of all children not only through the sporting skills taught, but through the underpinning values of perseverance, respect and hard work that PE promotes.</p>	<p>PE at Lunsford Primary School provides challenging and enjoyable learning in a range of sporting activities including gymnastics, dance, swimming and invasion games, net and wall games, striking and fielding games and outdoor adventure activities.</p> <p>Pupils participate in two high quality PE lessons each week, covering two sporting disciplines every half term. One lesson is delivered by the class teacher supported by a Pass specialist PE teacher. PE is adapted when necessary to ensure it is fully inclusive and all children are engaged.</p> <p>Progression of skills throughout the Key Stages is guaranteed by the use of Pass plans and curriculum mapping.</p> <p>Children are encouraged to participate in varied after school and lunch time sports clubs and are invited to attend both inter and intra competitive sporting events. Each year group takes part in six personal challenges throughout the year. This encourages not only physical development but mental wellbeing.</p> <p>Each year a group of Year 5 and 6 children are invited to become Sports Leaders for the school. They act as sporting role models for the younger children, assisting with lunchtime clubs, our annual Sports day and other sporting activities.</p> <p>Lunsford Primary School is currently achieving Gold Standard in the Schools Games Mark.</p> <p>Forest School is taught as part of our PE curriculum. Each class attends two sessions per half term where the children enjoy hands-on, creative and fulfilling learning opportunities.</p>	<p>All children are involved and included in PE lessons.</p> <p>Evidence of progression and varied lessons can be seen in floor books which also include examples of pupil voice.</p> <p>All year groups take part in personal, intra and inter challenge competitions.</p> <p>There is an annual Sports week during which sports day takes place. All children participate in various activities gaining points for their school house. Pupil Voice surveys have determined which after-school clubs are run by staff.</p> <p>Identification of children not accessing extracurricular or out of school activities (including walking to school) has been made and these children are personally invited to participate in lunch time activities. Sporting success both within and outside school are celebrated at special merit assemblies.</p> <p>Equipment is provided at playtimes to promote physical activity and exercise.</p> <p>During the year we welcome a Kent County cricket coach to provide specialist cricket to KS2 classes. Children experience the freedom to explore the outside area safely, interacting with nature, learning rustic crafts and generally enjoying the forest area.</p>
