Apostrophes and plurals

When we use apostrophes, we usually put the apostrophe before the letter 's':

The dog's kennel has a red roof.

(This means that there is only one dog)

BUT when we are using apostrophes with plurals, the apostrophe comes after the letter 's'.



The dogs' kennel has a red roof.

(This means that there is more than one dog)
