Read from page 7 – page 11 (double page spread of the Great Storm Cat.)

At the beginning of the week, we described the storm. You can use your ideas for today's lesson.

Mowzer is now on the boat in the middle of the storm. Mowzer sings his song to calm the Great Storm Cat. We are going to put words to Mowzer's song today and tomorrow.

Look at the picture of the boat being tossed about at sea within the paws of the Storm Cat:

- 1) Think about what Mowzer can hear, see, and very importantly, how it makes him feel. Write adventurous words and phrases that Mowzer might say to the Storm Cat around the edge of the picture. Use a thesaurus to improve at least three of your words.
- 2) Think of a 2-line chorus for your song. You can 'magpie' ideas from my chorus (below), or create your own. The chorus will repeat between your verses.
- 3) Begin to draft your verses for Mowzer's song.

I will use a 4-line verse / chorus structure.

I will show my modelled version tomorrow. The whole 'song' (or poem) will be Mowzer's words to try to calm the Great Storm Cat.

My chorus will be:

Oh Great Storm Cat, rest, relax, be calm.

We are just fishermen and mean you no harm.

Tomorrow, we will edit and write up our songs.

Reading Comprehension – Mother Teresa (if you still have the fact-file from last term that you printed, just print the corresponding question sheet – 1,2 or 3 star).

Topic – The Titanic:

This term, our topic will be The Titanic. As usual, we will start with a 'KWL' grid:

Task 1 - What you KNOW, what you WANT to know and WHAT you have learnt. Please fill in the first two columns only – as we'll fill in the last column at the end of the topic.

Task 2 - We will start this topic by looking at a local boy from Strood, which is about 10 miles from Lunsford Primary School. His name was Frank John William Goldsmith and he was 9-years old when he travelled on the Titanic. Please read the information about his life and highlight the bits you think are important. Use your highlighted text to write a paragraph (or about 12 bullet points) about his life. This may help you fill in the middle column of the KWL grid – what you want to find out!

Task 3 – Do some research on the Titanic – and fill in the basic facts on the research writing frame.

Mother Teresa. Listen to Mother Teresa's voice here – a recording of her reciting a prayer: <u>Make us worthy</u>, <u>Lord - YouTube</u>

'Make us worthy, Lord
To serve our fellow humans throughout the world
Who live and die in poverty or hunger.
Give them, through our hands
This day their daily bread,
And by our understanding love, Give peace and joy.'

In this prayer, there are themes of love, the duty to serve and the idea that serving the poor is a privilege. From stories of Mother Teresa, consider: in what ways did Mother Teresa putting into action the teachings of Jesus? Someone once said, "God has no voice but ours, no hands but ours" – perhaps you could discuss with an adult what this might mean?

Task: (See worksheet on Class Page):

- 1. There are 6 quotes from Mother Teresa. For each, consider what they mean and whether they are easy to follow.
- 2. Answer the final question (question 7) in a paragraph did Mother Teresa follow Jesus well? Why? Why not? Give examples.
